MISSA Spring Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order: 4:50pm by MISSA President Frank Ustach.

1. Scheduling

a) Discussion of the proposed Fall 2013 schedule and the need for qualifiers for the MISSA Great Lakes Championship Regatta. There will be 6 teams who qualify from each region plus one Last Chance regatta to add 2 more teams for a total of 20. All members present reviewed the proposed schedule and a discussion followed. Many questions were asked about how the regattas were chosen and why they were ranked a 1, 2 or 3 on the tiering.

Frank Ustach reported that the regattas were chosen as the qualifiers per regions (East, Central & West) was based on the largest number of High Schools and boats to sail at the same event in fall of 2012. The qualifying regattas are not cut in stone and can be reviewed per year to move locations to make travel less within the district.

b) The levels of tiers are based on the size and length of the regatta.

Level 3 is local to each region and often are one day regattas.

Level 2 are the qualifying regattas both Missa and ISSA Great Oakes Invitational.

Level 1 Missa Cressy Qualifier for ISSA Singlehanded Championship and the Missa Great Lakes Championship regattas.

Discussion about not having the laser as part of the Great Lakes Championship regatta. Chicago Yacht Club (Martha Pitt) will check this out and get back to Frank.

The fall schedule was voted on and accepted as proposed by a unanimous vote.

- c) Frank discussed having more regattas on the same weekends in each region of the district. Getting more kids sailing and keeping expenses down by less travel. Some discussion about holding some regattas during the week.
- d) None ISSA Event: Frank said all regattas being called High School regattas or for High School Sailing should be sailed under the ISSA Rules and all teams who participate by the ISSA and MISSA rules should be current registered teams. This has come from Tim Hogan the President of ISSA (Inter Scholastic Sailing Association the governing body of all High School Sailing) He asked that all NOR's list the ISSA Sailing Procedural Rules be followed and made clear on the notice. We should all be promoting all teams to join Missa and Issa. The more teams we have the more spots we get for ISSA Nationals Regattas.
- 2. Entry Fees/ Event structure: In order to keep the cost down for all teams and regatta hosts it was discussed have no breakfast or lunches at regattas. To many regatta hosts are left with food that is not eaten and wasted. It was suggested by some coaches that bringing a cooler and having the kids bring their own lunches to regattas was better since it is so hard to accommodate all the dietary needs of the sailors. Many coaches discussed about not having t-shirts and awards at regattas other than the Qualifying regattas for ISSA Championships and Missa District Championships. Many teams are feeling that it is getting to expensive to get to regattas and when teams cancel the host is left with extra shirts etc. Frank made it clear he would not tell any regatta hosts they could not charge 60.00 for an entry fee but wants us all to lower the cost of regattas.
- 3. District sails update: Missa now has 24 sails and 24 jibs. We used Missa funds to purchase the new sails to be sure we have enough for district qualifiers.
